ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

At BGA, we prioritize being STUDENT-athletes. To participate in athletic events, students must maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA. Additionally, students who are failing or at risk of failing their last-period classes will not be dismissed for athletic events.







Updated Attendance Policy SY 24/25

Multi-Tiered System of Support for Attendance

Tier 1Teachers/Advisors

When a student misses **3 days**, it is important for the advisor and/or teachers to:

- CheckIn:Reachouttothe student to ensure everything is okay and address any concerns they might have.
- OfferSupport:Provideany necessary support or resources to help the student get back on track.
- RemindofAttendancePolicy:
 Remind students of the school's
 attendance policy and the
 importance of regular
 attendance.
- Notifyappropriateschool counselor for attendance monitoring purposes.

Tier 2

Teachers/ Advisors + SST

When a student accumulates 4 unexcused absences:

Attendance Team Communication: The Attendance Team will notify the advisor / teacher of the students.

Advisor Action: The advisor should call home using the provided script [LINK HERE] to discuss the absences and provide support.

Subsequent Absences: For each additional unexcused absence beyond the initial 4, another call home and/or email should be made. This communication should:

- Informparentsofthecontinued absences.
- RemindfamiliesoftheBGA attendance policy.
- Inquireifthestudentorfamily needs any additional support or resources.

Tier 3

SST + Student Re-Engagement Coordinator

Lower House:

- 6Absences:Anin-personfamily meeting is required.
- 8Absences:Anattendanceplan will be created in Panorama. ACRAfilingwillbeinitiatedfor students under the age of 16 (Re-Engagement Coordinator).

Upper House:

- 8Absences:Anin-personfamily meeting is required.
- 10Absences:Anattendance plan will be created in Panorama.
- Studentsundertheageof16 will also have a CRA filing.
- Saturdayschoolwillbeassigned.

Saturday School:

- AttendanceMonitoring:
 Students will be monitored for 2 weeks following Saturday school.
- 1or2UnexcusedAbsences:The student may attend Homework Club to make up for the absences.
- Morethan2Unexcused
 Absences: The student will return to Saturday School for additional support.

Boston Public Schools Respiratory Virus Illness Protocols



THIS GUIDANCE OUTLINES THE ISOLATION AND EXPOSURE PROTOCOLS FOR MANAGING RESPIRATORY VIRUSES, INCLUDING COVID-19, INFLUENZA (FLU), RESPIRATORY SYNCYTIAL VIRUS (RSV), AND OTHER COMMON RESPIRATORY INFECTIONS. IT PROVIDES CLEAR, ACTIONABLE STEPS TO REDUCE THE SPREAD OF THESE ILLNESSES AND ENSURE THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITIES.

ISOLATION PROTOCOL



INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE ABLE TO MASK:

ISOLATE UNTIL THERE IS SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENT IN OVERALL SYMPTOMS AND YOU ARE FEVER FREE WITHOUT THE USE OF FEVER REDUCING MEDICATION FOR AT LEAST 24 HOURS.

RETURN TO SCHOOL **24 HOURS AFTER THE CRITERIA ABOVE ARE MET** AND CONSISTENTLY WEAR A WELL-FITTING DISPOSABLE MASK AROUND OTHERS FOR THE NEXT 5 DAYS.

INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE UNABLE TO MASK:

ISOLATE UNTIL ALL SYMPTOMS HAVE SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVED, AND YOU ARE FEVER FREE WITHOUT THE USE OF FEVER REDUCING MEDICATION FOR AT LEAST 24 HOURS.

RETURN TO SCHOOL 24 HOURS AFTER THE CRITERIA ABOVE ARE MET.

EXPOSURE PROTOCOL

NO QUARANTINE IS NECESSARY.

IT IS RECOMMENDED TO WEAR CONSISTENTLY WEAR A WELL-FITTING

DISPOSABLE FOR 5 DAYS

MONITOR CLOSELY FOR SYMPTOMS AND STAY HOME IF SYMPTOMS

DEVELOP.


